

Overview of Pai Chai University

■ General Information

- Established by Rev. Henry G. Appenzeller, an American Missionary, In 1885.
- **Foundation Motto:** Whoever would be great among you must be your servant (Matthew 20:26)
- **Affiliated Schools:** Pai Chai middle school and high school, Pai Chai University (Main Campus and Daedeok Valley Campus), Graduate School, Specialized Graduate Schools, University affiliated Kindergarten
- **Education Goal:** Fostering young Appenzellers with 'servant leadership' mindset who can contribute to community, society and humanity
- **Capacity**
 - 6 colleges 7 divisions 27 departments (40 majors), Graduate School (34 master courses, 28 doctoral courses) and Specialized Graduate Schools
 - about 10,000 students, 600 international students from 40 countries, about 300 faculty members, about 200 administration staff
- **Location: Daejeon Metropolitan City**
 - about 1.5 million populations, located in the central region of South Korea, Daejeon serves as a hub of transportation, the capital city, Seoul is about 160km away and it takes about 50 minutes by KTX (high speed train)
 - as one of South Korea's administration hubs, Government Complex Daejeon and national government offices are located in Daejeon
 - called the "Science City, high technology city", Its Daedeok Innopolis is the home of government-funded public research institutes, corporate R&D centers and venture companies
- **Globalization**
 - signed MoU with 223 universities in 40 countries
 - about 80 to 100 students are reciprocated every year through student exchange programs
 - 500 international students from 40 countries are studying
 - participating in the GKS undergraduate, GKS graduate, Korean language program and GKS exchange program
- **Education Center For Korean and a Foreign Language(ECKFL)**
 - opened in 1992, awarded the 26th King Sejong Culture Prize in Education by the Ministry of Culture and Tourism
 - operating Korean class level 1 to 6 in a quarter academic calendar
 - has 25 seasoned Korean language instructors and many of them are participating as a TOPIK examiner or grader
 - publishes its own Korean text books
 - runs King Sejong Institutes in Brazil and Nepal
- **Supports for International Students**
 - Free airport pickup for newly admitted international students, student visa extension assistance, health insurance arrangement, extracurricular cultural activities, etc.

Student Exchange Program

Students who are enrolled in partner universities of PCU and selected as exchange students by the partner universities are able to study one or two semesters at PCU. International exchange students may take classes up to 18 credits per semester.

■ Provided Classes

A. Exchange students who have zero Korean language knowledge or level 2 or lower in TOPIK, or equivalent Korean proficiency are arranged to take a set of Korean language classes provided by the department of Korean Language and Literature which open exclusively for international students.

Subject(credit)	Korean Speaking(3), Korean Listening(3), Korean Reading(3), Korean Writing(3) and Korean Grammar & vocabulary(3), total 15 credits
Level	Beginner (Level 1 ~ 2), Intermediate (Level 3 ~ 4), Advanced (Level 4 ~ 6) (A class level is assigned after a placement test.)
Class time	9:00 to 12:00, Monday to Friday, total 15 hours per week

- Exchange students can take additional undergraduate classes up to 3 credits.

B. Exchange students who have Level 3 or higher in TOPIK (Test of Proficiency in Korean), or equivalent Korean proficiency are allowed to take undergraduate classes provided from all departments and divisions. Those classes are taught in Korean and open for full-time students and exclusively for international students of PCU.

- A class PCU provides is 2 credits or 3 credits.

■ Estimated Costs

TB and Hepatitis B test	10,000KRW in a local clinic

Alien card registration fee	Approx. 30,000KRW

■ Notes

- All of the exchange students are required to live on-campus dormitory. On-campus dormitory residents are required to submit a Hepatitis B and tuberculosis test result to the dormitory office.

- Exchange students are subject to the mandatory subscription to the National health insurance of Korea from the date of alien registration. Alien registration takes about a month. Therefore, it is advised to buy travelers insurance covering and the first month in Korea to get reimbursement of medical expenses.
